HOW TO SUBMIT MINUTES

Before you prepare the minutes for your singing, please familiarize yourself with the general format and style of the minutes of other singings and try to use the same format and style for your minutes. The following pointers may also be helpful:

- Name/Location/Date/Time Please start the minutes with three lines showing the name of the singing, the location, the calendar date on which it was held.
- Breaks Please indicate breaks using RECESS or LUNCH, capitalized and on a line by themselves.
- Two-Day Singings Indicate the start of a second or third day of singing with the day and date spelled out on a line by itself.
- Names Please try to verify the spellings of all names. Do not put state names or abbreviations after singers' names. Do not insert commas between the name and the first song number.
- **Song Numbers** Please list songs only by number. List the name of a song only if the song does not appear in *The Sacred Harp*, 1991 *Edition*. If two songs begin on the same page, be sure to add "t" for top or "b" for bottom to the page number. For example: 31t or 49b. If a particular song is the only song beginning on its page, a "t" or "b" should not be used. For example: 306 (not 306b).
- Memorial Lesson When listing those memorialized, please indicate the state of origin and year of death if known. If convenient, list those from the same state together.
- Officers Please list the new officers at the end of the minutes, ending with the name of the secretary who is submitting the minutes.
- **Payment** Each singing must pay a fee to appear in the minutes. The fee entitles the singing to receive 10 copies of the minutes book per singing day. Minutes received without payment will not appear in the book.
- Fees \$37 per singing day if you want the books mailed to you

COMPUTER INSTRUCTIONS

If you are using a computer to prepare your minutes, you can save us from re-typing them by sending the minutes on disk or by e-mail. Both Macintosh and PC users are welcome to send disks. Please follow the directions below carefully.

- **Before You Start** First read *How to Submit Minutes* on page 3, and follow the instructions. If your minutes are not formatted correctly, we will have to re-type them.
- **Formatting** Do not use bold, italics, underline, or other special formatting. Do not center the title. Do not type the title in upper case. We will add these formatting elements later.
- Hard Returns Never insert returns in the middle of a paragraph—instead, allow paragraphs to wrap to the full column width. Include hard returns (¶ marks or line breaks) only at the end of paragraphs and single lines. Don't use two returns in a row.
- File Format When done editing, please save the file in "Text Only" format (this will intentionally remove any special formatting you may have used, such as bold or italic). If your word processor offers a choice between Text Only and Text Only With Line Breaks—be sure to choose Text Only because Text Only With Line Breaks will insert unwanted hard returns into the file.
- **File Name** Save the file with a name that is only eight characters or fewer. Add the extension ".TXT", indicating that it is a text file. For example: LIBERTY.TXT.
- Disk Format Use a 3.5-inch floppy disk formatted for DOS.
 Macintosh users: if you have System 7.5 or later and/or PC Exchange, you can format a DOS disk using the Erase Disk command or, send by e-mail.
- To Submit by E-Mail If you have access to e-mail, send the file as an attachment to: minutes@fasola.org. Don't include the minutes in the message body itself unless you are certain that the mail program will not add unwanted hard returns.
- Always Send a Printout Please mail a printout along with your payment. This allows us to re-type the minutes in the event the disk or e-mail attachment is damaged or unreadable.

The memorial lesson followed. Lee Rogers made the following opening remarks. "As at each Sacred Harp convention, we pause in the midst of singing to remember those we have been privileged to sing with who have died since we last met here. Each year that I have been involved in Sacred Harp singing there are more names on the memorial list with whom I have personally shared song, and who have touched my life. Some of the people on this year's list were unquestionably Sacred Harp heroes, who helped to shape the tradition and who have guided generations of singers. I came to know these people late in their lives, but not too late to be inspired by them. Every month I looked forward to Friday night singing with "Miss Dollie" Hudgins in Alpharetta, Georgia; her spirit has reached hundreds of new singers she never met through her grandson, Richard DeLong. Then there was Alabama's own Virgil Phillips, whose warmth lit up a singing, even when he could no longer stand in the center of the square and lead us in song. His joy in "Liberty", and his truly "Thankful Heart" we all share he made them a part of our culture."

"But especially in our thoughts and hearts these last few days has been our most recent loss, one whose morning sun has set at noon. Karen House, who died earlier this week, was one of the many young singers who came to Sacred Harp as an adult. In many ways, in her enthusiasm and her musicality, she was typical of these young converts to Sacred Harp. I remember perhaps a dozen years ago when her sister Kelly brought her to a singing in Connecticut. I learned early in our acquaintance that Karen had a life endangering heart condition, but as I got to know her I almost forgot that, because she never let it keep her from singing or from living. Karen embraced life wholeheartedly, and that's how she took to Sacred Harp music. We could count on seeing her down here two or three times a year; I had looked forward to singing with her this week, and I just learned that she was planning to spend most of the summer in Alabama, a dream she'd had for some time."

"Karen knew better than most of us, and certainly earlier, that "the moment when our lives begin, we all begin to die." She knew also how to live as fully as possible. I know she found comfort in these songs and in the warmth and support of the Sacred Harp community. So, too, these comfort us in the loss of those we've loved. Karen wanted her friends to remember her with joy and with singing. Certainly we have cause to celebrate the singers and friends of Sacred Harp, even as we mourn them. Karen and the others on today's list helped show us how to live. Individually and as a community, we are all nourished by their spirits." Kelly House spoke in memory of her sister, Karen, and how much the community of Sacred Harp had enriched their lives and led song on page 318. Mike Hinton made the following remarks. "We Sacred Harp singers gather round a hollow square and raise our hearts and voices in praise to God. What other activity in our lives involves a hollow square? The hollow square seems to be a truly unique aspect of our tradition. Would the music be the same if the class sat in any other configuration? I don't think any of us can consider Sacred Harp the same if the class sat like a choir, for instance.

So, what is special about the hollow square? First, it's a place where we can do things "our" way. We choose a song, we pick the tempo, and we sing a tune. We sing as many verses as we choose. The leader leads friends in praises to our Lord and King. The hollow square is also a place where we watch a leader and we watch each other. We share glances; we shed a tear for a special song. We share each other. We sing together in musical fellowship. We gather in places all across this land and in lands far from here. We share hugs, concerns, celebrations, all within a few feet of this special place, this hollow square. Here we feel the Holy Spirit's presence. Perhaps we are practicing for the day when we'll gather round that eternal hollow square when we sing around God's throne. There is no seat in the room where you can hear Sacred Harp like you can in the center of the square. Sometimes we want to dance or take wings and soar away."

"Today we celebrate the lives and cherish the memories of some of our dear Sacred Harp singers. They have heard God say "come weary dove, here is thy home, come fold your wings and stay." God called Virgil Phillips from Alabama: "Come, Virgil, leave your oxygen tank, here is your home to stay." God called Ed Craig from Texas: "Come, Ed, leave your worn boots and come home to stay." God called Mrs. Dollie DeLong Hudgins to leave family and friends and come home to stay.

I'm told that the last singing my grandfather attended he had three of his grown children there, they had all four parts covered that day. As he sang what was his last song, he walked to each of his children and shook hands with them. That song ended with these words:

Sing a sweet song such as angels may have Praise ye the Lord that I'm freed from all care, Pray ye the Lord that my joys ye shall share; Look up on high and believe that I'm there, When I am gone, when I am gone."

Carol Selleck gave a tribute to Sacred Harp members who have gone on to "The Great Convention in the Sky." We miss our friends, their voices, and the contributions they made towards putting on a good singing; but most of all we miss their presence in our midst for they came with pure hearts, sweet smiles, and friendly words. We remember them for their zeal and love of the music, but we rejoice in the knowledge that they are now singing with that larger gathering of singers. Among their survivors are we, their family of singers, who shall carry forth their songs. May we each be blessed to follow their examples of love. There are others who we wish to remember today. They are unable to be with us because of illness, age, or infirmity. Their longing to be here saddens us, for we want them here, so we shall hold their names up in our thoughts and include them on our list. All these people who we have named are the links that, one by one, voice by voice, link by link, form a long chain of melodies stretching back to our first Sacred Harp singing. They, along with the hundreds of others who have been memorialized at all the conventions over the years, are how we got from that very first singing to today's Rocky Mountain Convention here in Tijeras, New Mexico.

Our conventions are dual in nature, consisting of the "back then" and the "here and now." It is a bridge made of lyrics, harmony, rhythm, and union of voices, and we are the tribe of singers who travel over the bridge. We are non-

denominational, a tribe that collectively seeks the fruits of the spirit by gathering all over the country several times a year and singing our hearts out. Being counted among a group of singers is a wonderful experience. I found the first group of singers in the Old Testament, the tribe of Levi, one of the twelve tribes of Israel appointed to the service of the tabernacle of the Lord. The Levites had the respect of all the other tribes, for they were "more upright in heart" (II Chronicles 29:34). I Chronicles 9:33 establishes their authority: "And these are the singers." This Levitical line was "commanded to sing praise unto the Lord with the words of David" (II Chronicles 29: 30). We, too, strive to be more upright in heart, and with this as our example, I add them to our memorial list 2000.

Another line of singers for us to include is the "Yankee Tunesmiths" and the "Southern Singing Masters." They exploded onto the music world a few hundred vears back with their people's music for the common folk, and they, too, were as dedicated as Levi's tribe to "sing praises unto the Lord." They gave us our inheritance of fuging tunes and folk hymns, textual sentimentality and anthems, gospel lyrics, and odes. In the Lloyd's Hymnal, selection number 206 profiles these singers with the words: "however employed their joy was the same; they never were cloved in hymning the Lamb; their sole recreation to sing of His praise, and publish salvation by Jesus' grace. Men, in their own eyes were children again, and children were wise and solid as men; the women were fearful of nothing but sin; their hearts were all cheerful, their consciences clean." I think this describes my grandparents, and maybe it describes yours. My grandmother, Exer Anna Sheppard Hand, like her husband and her parents, were Sacred Harpers. Eighty years ago, my father, Elder Gerald Hand, then age six, went to his first Sacred Harp singing at the County Courthouse in Franklin County, Tennessee. He saw more people than he had ever seen, and in his eyes, the horses and buggies, mule teams, and wagons outnumbered the people. My first Sacred Harp recollection was about fifty years ago at a big camp meeting of the West Texas Association of the Primitive Baptist Church. A huge tent, called "the tabernacle," was maintained for this annual meeting, but that's not where I heard the music, since Sacred Harp is not used in our worship service. The food tents had long lines three times a day, and the people stood in line singing Sacred Harp. Listening to the music flow up and down the line fed the soul. So many links, so many happy faces, that I just wanted to include them in our Memorial 2000. And fast forwarding to the "here and now"; yesterday, a brand new link attended her first Sacred Harp singing, my great niece, twelve year old Leighanna Sewell, with her attendance here, has become my family's first sixth generation singer. Our singing endures and Curtis Owen knows why. For you who have yet to meet Curtis Owen, he is an influential eighty years old singer over at McMahon, Texas. When he was being interviewed by the Texas Monthly Magazine regarding their 100th anniversary singing last spring, and was asked, "why has the singing endured for a hundred years?" Curtis replied, "Because we like it." The bridge got weak awhile back and looked like it was on its last note. However, it got shored up by a stubborn, dedicated bunch of people like Curtis Owen. Leon Ballinger is another. He's gone to more singings, pitched more songs, and chaired more conventions in a year than most of us attended in a lifetime. Then there's Hugh McGraw. He saw it dying out and started stoking the fire. He encouraged, recruited, promoted, wrote songs, published books, appeared on national television, and fanned life into that fire, and Sacred Harp is now experiencing a great comeback. The small circle of hollow squares got bigger and bigger as more newcomers discovered and embraced the sound, effused it with energy and

enthusiasm, and stepped forward to help carry the torch. Carla Smith is a leader of the new line of Sacred Harp singers and comes to our memorial lesson with a different perspective, but with the same intent. Following Carla's memorial lesson, my sister, Janet Morgan, will close with number 55, "Sister's Farewell", which for today we shall think of as "A Singer's Farewell." All four parts will be led with Janet on the lead, Carla on the treble, Jerry Schreiber on the bass, and myself on the alto.

When you add up the list of Shut-ins, Deceased, Levites, Sacred Harp Founders, Franklin County Tennessee Singers, and the Singing Food Lines, today we have memorialized 2000 singers for our "Memorial 2000". Let our memories not dwell on the sadness of our friends leaving us, but let us cherish the good moments we had with them when they were here.
